View from the Caddyshack II

It is a day of music, inspiration, family, faith and fun, culminating with the celebration of the Eucharist about 8:30 p.m. and a gigantic fireworks display. The event is free and open to all, young and old.

New Roman Missal (Sacramentary): The new English translation of the Mass will be introduced on November 27, 2011, the First Sunday of Advent. From time to time, Fr. Franz and I will highlight the nature of these changes in bulletin articles. We will begin using the new introduction for the Our Father (At the Savior's command, and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say...) and the prayer before the distribution of Communion (Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb). Our prayers will become more scriptural. As we use the new translation, the connection to Bible stories will become more apparent to us.

Vocation View: Do not be afraid; have faith and trust the Lord's call. Consider being a priest, brother, sister or deacon.

Some words to live by: "We do not smile because something good has happened; rather something good happens because we smile." (Japanese proverb)

Some humor to survive by: After Quasimodo's death, the bishop of the Cathedral of Notre Dame sent word throughout Paris that a new bell-ringer was needed. The bishop decided to conduct the interviews in the belfry. Several applicants demonstrated their skills, when a lone, armless man climbed the steps and said he was there to apply for the bell-ringer's job. The incredulous bishop said, "But you have no arms!" "No matter," said the man, "Observe." He then began striking the bells with his face, producing a beautiful melody. The astonished bishop listened and knew he had found a suitable replacement for Quasimodo.

But suddenly, the armless man tripped, and plunged out the belfry window to his death. When the stunned bishop reached the street, a crowd had gathered around the fallen man, drawn by the beautiful music they had heard only moments before. One of them asked, "Bishop, who was this man?" "I don't know his name," the bishop sadly replied, "but his face rings a bell."

Despite the sad event, the bishop continued his interviews. The first applicant said, "Your Excellency, I am the twin brother of the poor, armless wretch who fell to his death from this very belfry yesterday. I beg that you honor his life by allowing me to replace him in this duty." The bishop agreed to give the man an audition, but as he prepared to ring the bells, the man groaned, clutched his chest and died on the spot. Two monks, hearing the bishop's cries of grief at this second tragedy, rushed up the stairs to his side. "What has happened?" the first monk asked breathlessly, "who is this man?" "I don't know his name," sighed the bishop, "but he's a dead ringer for his brother."
